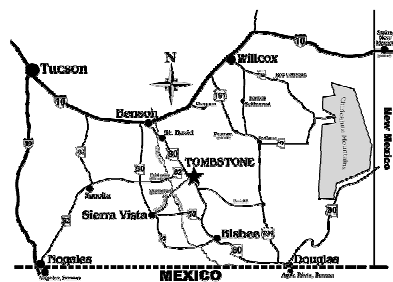
Future: Banner University Medicine

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Lessons Learned about Curriculum Development*

- Home-based Primary Care is an optimal clinical model for interprofessional/trainee geriatric education and training
- Experiences must be authentic and meaningful
- Training plan should manage potential barriers (safety, supervision, travel time)
- Training should provide win-win for program directors, filling content gaps and assuring sustainability

 - AAHCM has created a list of core HBPC competencies that will help guide clinical content

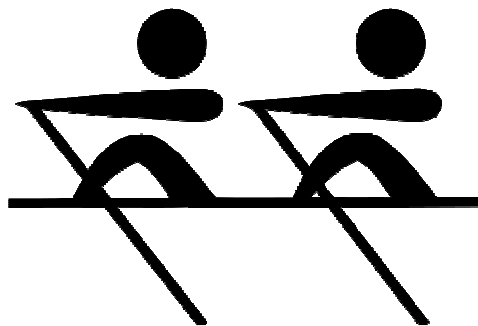

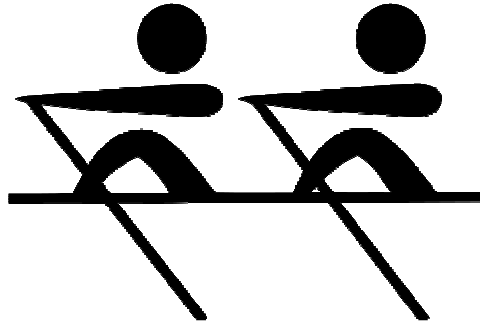
